## AHPA Treasure's Report

### for the 2017-2018 year ending August 31, 2018

The Notice to Reader was completed by Geoff Carter, CPA, CGA of Calgary. He is associated with Carstairs Accounting Services of Carstairs.

At August 31, 2018, the AHPA had \$162,000 in cash and GIC's.

The unadjusted value of inventory of clothing, horseshoes and other game related items was valued at \$8800. 3 sets of courts were sold for \$2250. There are more available for sale for the same price of \$750. Please contact Mike Holley to make arrangements for pickup or delivery.

The casino income received in February was \$68,000.

Alberta Sport Connection has revamped their program and the AHPA received almost \$3000 more this year than last. Over the next 5 years, the grant will increase each year, provided the AHPA meets all of the criteria.

10 bursaries were approved and paid out in early September. To date only 1 thank you has been received.

The AHPA printed brochures to advertise who, what and where we are and many have been distributed by the Zone directors. Thanks to Cindy for putting the brochure together.

None of the 2018 Out-of-Province travel was paid out prior to yearend due to waiting for approval from AGLC.

The unadjusted net income for the 2018 year was \$62,205. The unadjusted net deficit was \$6100 when the casino income is not included. This is an improvement of \$18,000 from the previous year. All budgets must be balanced over a 2 year period. The annual report was submitted to AGLC regarding the AHPA financial documents in April 2018.

The files are available to anyone wanting to review them. Please arrange an appointment time and I will ensure all records are available and also a computer that has the capability required to provide the financial data. All records other than the current year are stored here in the Alberta Room.

The High Prairie Club started off the year hearing that we had Provincial approval to host the 2020 Canadian Horseshoe Pitching Championships.

On May 16, the club received approval from Horseshoe Canada that we were granted the 2020 Canadian Horseshoe Pitching Championships.

The High Prairie Horseshoe Club held Tuesday night club nights all summer with good turnout. By the end of August, we had some new members that were attending regularly and interested also in playing in the tournament.

## Alberta Sports Report 2018

The Alberta Sport Connection has made changes during the past year regarding the information required for our grant and the amount of the grant itself. Many of the documents they required and the surveys we completed can now be accessed online. This means that we do not have near as much paperwork to submit as in other years in that only updating is required for some of the documents, not a total rehash of the document. Currently, no new information other than an update of the executive after our AGM is required until March 31, 2019, the end of their fiscal year.

Most importantly and beneficially great for us, their association is equaling out the amount of funding each sport receives. They have broken down the sports requesting funding into 3 groups. We are placed in the third group. In the next few years, each sport in the group will receive equal funding when the process is complete. Currently, we are at the bottom on the list. This spring our grant was increased to \$11, 502.00, an increase of \$3,452.00.

Cindy and I met with a representative from ASC in March of 2018. The changes I have mentioned were explained to us at that time. One of the comments that he made was that our sport was one of the few that could involve the entire family in that it caters to young children all the way to folks in their late senior years.

#### 2018 Membership Report

2018 was a busy year for the membership of the AHPA. Currently we have 249 paying members. Our paying membership increased by 54 new members, 39 of whom were males and 15 of whom were females. Of these new members, 19 were players, 4 were nonplayers and 31 were associates. Unfortunately, our junior membership decreased from 8 to 5.

In comparison to 2017, we have an increase of 19 players, a decrease of 4 nonplayers, an increase of 31 associates, a decrease of 3 juniors and an increase of 283 students.

Bentley, Calgary, Medicine Hat, Ponoka and Red Deer were busy instructing students from the schools throughout the year for a combined total of 800, almost 300 more than last year. Way to go! Medicine Hat, after instructing their students who came out to play, planned a tournament the following week whereby a student was matched with a player and the tournament was on. Lloyd reported that great fun was had by all.

Some confusion occurred when membership numbers were given out by the tournament director. Until these were given to the membership committee, other new members had to wait for their forms to be processed and then given a new number. In addition to this, many membership forms were incompletely filled out-some had no addresses, no phone numbers, or no signatures or dates. It helps us do up the membership when these forms are completed as we need to share some of this information with the tournament director or the secretary. This year's inductee to the AHPA Hall of Fame started at a very young age. She had great success at the local, Provincial, Canadian and World Tournament levels. Some of the records set by this individual in the 1990's still stand today. She is the second of three Canadians to win a Provincial, Canadian and World title in one year.
