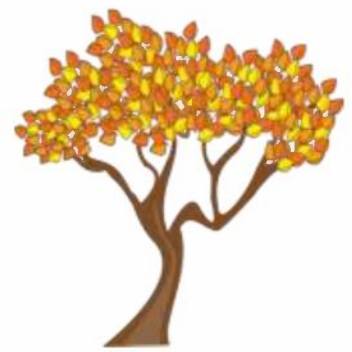

**CALL TO ORDER:** Meeting called to order by Cindy Ekkel, President and welcomed members and guests.

**ANNOUNCEMENTS:** Cindy advised times for lunch and dinner. Also went over the protocol regarding motions and discussions of motions; as well for voting and scrutineers.

Alfred Hansen moved to accept the added items to the Agenda; seconded by Dianne Pearce.

**APPROVAL OF 2018 AGM MINUTES:** Russell Mercer moved to accept the 2018 AGM Minutes as distributed. Egon Sandau Seconded. Motion Carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Mary Holley presented the Treasurer's report. Copies given out at the meeting but can be obtained from Mary. Mary went over the revenue, expenses and other items regarding the AHPA. Balance Sheet was completed from August 31, 2019. Financials to be posted in the Fall Newsletter. Mary made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report and Financials as presented. Seconded by Rod Nieman, Motion carried.

**BUDGET:** Mary Holley presented the Budget for 2020 and 2021; the budget must be balanced every two years. 2020 Budget for total revenue at \$122,000; 2021 budget for total revenue at \$24,400. Receive Casino money once every two years. Estimated expenses for 2020 at \$78,300; estimated expenses for 2021 at \$64,700. Copy of budget can be obtained from Mary. Mary made a motion to accept the budget for 2020 and 2021 as draft budgets. Dave Kilbourn seconded; Motion carried.

**CORRESPONDENCE & SECRETARY REPORT:** Gail Aker gave her report on correspondence received, through working with Winnona Kilbourn, the undeliverable emails have been reduced down to five from over 21. She also noted the Society Annual Return was submitted January 6, 2019; received back approved on June 26, 2019. Further correspondence to be covered under Bylaws agenda Item. Gail moved to accept Correspondence and Secretary report as written. Louie Lallier Seconded; Motion Carried.

**2020 Canadian-** Ray Prevost: AHPA set a committee to assist with the 2020 Canadians; \$20,000 added prize money donated; Saskatchewan and BC players are already requesting information on accommodations.

**2020 Western Canada Classic-** Mary Holley: On September 21, 2019 at the Calgary Horseshoe Club General Meeting; a motion was presented to withdraw from the Western Canada Classic and vote to allow the High Prairie Horseshoe Club use the pre-Canadian tournament being held on August 14 & 15, 2020 to be called the Western Canada Classic. Motion carried.

**CASINO:** Mary Holley noted to the members the AHPA Casino will be held on December 9 and 10 and that AHPA will continue to pay for travel, awards, etc.

## OLD BUSINESS

1. Handicapping Options – Dianne Beck- not covered at this meeting.
2. Bylaws- Gail Aker- Report attached. Motion by Gail Aker to make the necessary corrections and resubmit the 2019 Bylaws to Corporate Registry under Special Resolution. Alfred Hansen seconded. Motion carried.

## NEW BUSINESS

- a. **Sportsmanship Award-** Cindy Ekkell for Gary Bartholet

Need new criteria for this award or will AHPA continue with this award?

- b. **Rant and Rave-** Cindy Ekkell

Comments are mostly good; eliminates the parking lot negativity; comments need to be typed out and given to the individual clubs holding the various tournaments.

- c. **AGM Voting Process-** Ray Prevost. Motion brought forward to change the voting process that each club would only have two (2) votes by their delegates. Seconded by Larry Fassnidge

Discussion concerning this motion brought up by various members; Mary advised that this process is currently not working for Horseshoe Canada; basing on the number of members in each province; Alberta would lose their vote because of the areas; Ontario has a larger number of members.

David Kilbourn agrees that all of the membership is to have a vote; that is why they are members and are entitled to vote.

Motion defeated.

- d. **AGM Awards** – Cindy Ekkell

All the nominees to be recognized and invited to the AGM when the recipient is to be announced.

- e. **Approval of Invoices** – Mary Holley

All invoices have been approved including the tournaments: Total: less than \$1,000.00 for Memorial travel assistance. Executive to approve all necessary invoices.



f. **AHPA Code of Conduct Policy-** Cindy Ekkel

The Executive has approved a new Code of Conduct Policy, ten (10) copies were distributed at the meeting.

g. **AHPA Sponsored Tournaments: Indoors/Outdoors.**

Ray Prevost moved that all three (3) AHPA major tournaments to be held outdoors to permit other communities hosting opportunities. Louie Lallier seconded.

Discussion: Dave Kilbourn stated no problem with other communities having the tournaments; however, if they have paid for a two-day tournament and it rains; what happens? Players would not be able to try and win more games on the second day.

Comments from several people that these tournaments should be held inside.

Winnona Kilbourn commented these are prestigious tournaments and participants receive plaques, shields and badges for the coats and shirts.

Mary Holley advised that the Calgary Horseshoe Club is available to any club who wants to hold a tournament; to be run as your tournament; kitchen facility can be used; however, the bar is licensed, and all funds go to the Calgary Horseshoe club.

Another comment: any community can hold in an area; Myrna Kissick stated it had already been passed that they must be held indoors.

Another comment: a two-day tournament has extra money; what happens if it is cancelled?

Mike Holley stated that this seems to be a movement to diminish AHPA, we are supposed to be proud of our organization and to promote the game of horseshoes; needs to be held indoors so that both days can be played.

Pros and cons both ways on this discussion. Voting held: Motion defeated; Russell Mercer moved to destroy the ballots.

h. **Hosting of 2020 AHPA AGM** – open for proposals.

Mary Holley moved for Calgary Horseshoe Club to bid for the 2020 AGM on October 3, 2020. 75% of AHPA members live from Red Deer to the south of the province.

Myrna Kissick moved for Innisfail Horseshoe Club to bid for the 2020 AGM. Meeting room at Peters Buffett at N/C; lunch and dinner Chinese buffet at \$25.00.

Wetaskiwin moved to have the 2020 AGM to be held in Red Deer at the Senior Citizens Downtown Club. Lunch to be served, \$100 rental fee, bar service.

The three motions were put to a ballot; Calgary Horseshoe Club to host the AHPA AGM on October 3, 2020.

Winnona Kilbourn moved to destroy ballots; Motion carried.

i. **AHPA Sanctioned Tournament Rules.** There are set rules in effect regarding when a club can hold a tournament and must not conflict with the major tournaments.

l. **Tournament Supplies-** Zone 4 questioned how does a club get from AHPA. Supplies are in the Alberta Room for AHPA.

m. **Playbook:** can a banner be posted a page in the handbook. Ray Prevost will be meeting with advertisers to see about the cost for ¼ page or ½ page.

n. **Membership forms-** Winnona Kilbourn reported there will be changes on the AHPA membership form to include cell phones, do Non players want to receive newsletter, do the fees need to be increased for N/Ps  
Winnona moved to raise cost on non-players who want to receive the newsletter from \$5.00 to \$10.00. Leo Conninx seconded. Discussion was to allow each club to make sure all the members have a copy of the newsletter; club could print off.

Motion defeated.

o. **Canstats:** Why so long to update the stats? Jane Cordingley advised that in the Bentley tournament she had received the information after the update. Keep in mind it is all volunteers who are doing all the work for the Canstats.

p. **Tournaments-** Jane Cordingley

Jane went over the tournament dates and these will be posted in the Fall Newsletter; if you need additional information, please contact Jane. I do have some dates if you require.

Mary Holley made a motion that participants to receive travel assistance for Western Canada Classic and the Canadians when held in Alberta and must attend three (3) sanctioned tournaments plus the Provincials in order to be compensated or travel according to AGLC guidelines. Ray Prevost seconded. Motion carried.

**Provincials 2020:** Mary Holley proposed on behalf of the Calgary Horseshoe Club to hold the Provincials on June 27 & 28, 2020. Food available; camping available. No other bids, Calgary awarded the 2020 Provincials.

**Alberta Open 2020:** Mary Holley proposed on behalf of the Calgary Horseshoe Club to hold the Alberta Open on August 1 & 2, 2020 and also because of the Canadians. No other bids, Calgary awarded the 2020 Alberta Open. The Alberta Open is early due to the Canadians being on the 3<sup>rd</sup> weekend in August.

**Fall Memorial 2020:** Mary Holley proposed on behalf of the Calgary Horseshoe Club to hold the Fall Memorial on September 19 & 20, 2020, which is the third weekend in September. No other bids, Calgary awarded the 2020 Fall Memorial.

Dave Burrows elected by acclamation.

## TRAVEL ASSISTANCE FROM AHPA 2020

Please read the following guidelines carefully. 2020 is a special year for the AHPA.

**World Tournament** assistance will be for players only based on the following criteria:

1. Must compete in 4 AHPA sanctioned tournament (1 of which must be the Provincial Championships)
2. Must submit a completed itinerary to Mary Holley by noon May 17, 2020
3. Must travel to and from Monroe, LA by the most direct route.
4. Payment will be based on receipts submitted after travel that meets the approval of AGLC and fit within the AHPA budget.
5. Claim form will be provided to you, by the treasurer, once you have attended the tournament.

**Western Canada Classic and Canadian Championships** assistance will be for players only.

1. Must compete in 4 AHPA sanctioned tournaments (1 must be the Provincial Championships)  
These tournaments must be between Sept 1, 2019 and the date you leave to travel to High Prairie.
2. No itinerary is necessary.
3. Claimants must live more than 100 km from High Prairie.
4. If participating in both tournaments the following guidelines apply
  - a. Fuel receipts from home to High Prairie
  - b. Western - 3 nights' accommodation – either RV parking or hotel/motel with a maximum of \$125 per night
  - c. Canadians - 4 nights' accommodation – as above
  - d. Fuel receipts from High Prairie to home.
5. If only participating in one of these 2 tournaments, a separate claim form will be provided.
6. The claim forms will provide separate lines for each segment.
7. Total claims must not exceed the AHPA 2020 budget. Payments will be calculated on a per cent base of receipts to budget.
8. All receipts must be attached to a sheet of paper that is 8 ½ x 11". **Do not hi-light on the receipts**, it will not photocopy. Remember all receipts are submitted to AGLC for review.

**Provincial Championship, AB Open and Memorial** will be treated the same as previous years.

1. Player must live 100 km from the tournament location.
2. 2 nights' accommodation (maximum of \$125 per night)
3. Fuel based on receipts (maximum of \$250)
4. Completed claim forms submitted by deadline with all receipts attached to a 8 ½ x 11 sheet of paper.

# ***SOPHIE KELTS BUILDER AWARD***

I am nominating Ray Prevost for the 2019.

Ray's ongoing promotion of horseshoes contributed to the High Prairie Club co-hosting an exceptional 2018 Alberta Open Tournament with record attendance (75 participants) which surely put the AHPA on the radar map in Northern Alberta. An Edmonton participant in this tournament contacted Ray this summer and asked him for help with dimensions and other information regarding establishing courts to which Ray gladly did. Ray's marketing and promotional strategies were remarkable; portraying the AHPA positively and additionally giving awareness to the sport itself.



On July 13 and 14 he set up 10 pits at the Rendezvous RV campsite in Peace River for a tournament they were holding. He had no assistance available from the campsite for set up so took on the task of setting up himself. Numbers were low due to other events in the area, but everyone had a good time and was a great introduction to pitching shoes for many. The campsite is hoping to do this again next year in conjunction with their 10th anniversary celebration. Most of the players will likely come to the High Prairie tournament.

August 2019 long weekend Ray was at Shaws Point Resort (Grouard) where he organized a fun tournament. He brought out the pits prior, but the organizers decided to use the pits at the campsite. 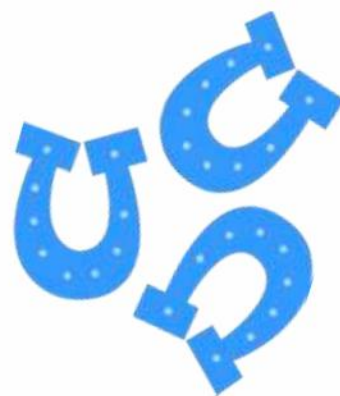
