Mary presented the 2021 Treasurers report. A Notice to Reader was compiled by Carstairs Accounting Services again this year. Geoff Carter, who had been the principal accountant for our account retired in August so new people working on this, but it was still reviewed by William Stevenson, CPA. William apologises for not being here today but had other commitments. A copy of the financials was made available on the tables when you arrived. I hope everyone has had a chance to have a quick look.

As of August 31, 2021, the association had \$84,665 in the four bank accounts and \$95,052 in GICs. The income was mostly the grant from Alberta Sport Connection. The major expenses were bursaries (\$8000), Insurance (\$2177) and the accountant fees (\$2100). To put that in prospective we budget \$10,000 per year for bursaries, insurance went down a few dollars and the accounting has been the same for many years. If another

firm were engaged to do the accounting the fees would range from \$5000 to \$10,000. Minor expenses were \$590 for new tires on the trailer and \$560 for travel to board meetings. Please note the notes on page 6 of the Financial the property is book value. It is insured for replacement value.

Budget 2022-2023

Revenue

Canadians Fund raising \$2000 is a very hopeful amount as that is normally from the silent auction at the Provincial tournaments. At this time, the AHPA does not have a casino date and there are not post re-opening casino \$\$ to gage what we will get when we finally do get a casino. The entry fees are based on having the Provincials, Alberta Open and Western Canada Classic next year and having great participation in all of them.

Expenses

The only out-of-province travel next year would be to the World Tournament in Monroe, LA.

The in-province travel is based on the Western Canada Classic and Canadians being held in High Prairie and the Provincials, AB Open and Memorial being held in Calgary. This budget is balanced every two years as per requirement by AGLC. The 2021 expenses were the lowest in many years and we may have caught up to do in the next few years as clubs get back to playing and may need more help with their courts.

AGLC is being understanding about spending the funds in the allotted two years. This budget may not be accurate for either income or expenses but hopefully we can operate in a more normal way next year.

Mary Holley moved to accept and approve the Budget Report and a draft for 2023 as presented. Seconded by Egon Sandau.

Questions: Jane asked why there is an increase in the budget for a website. It was stated due to the cost of the Calgary Horseshoe Club building a new website, that the AHPA would want to do the same.

Local horseshoe pitcher one of the best in Alberta

Usually the last weekend in June, Claresholm's Lyle Olmstead is participating in the provincial horseshoe championships, a title he has won four times.

This year, measures to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus have cancelled provincials and all major events.

Still Olmstead, as he sits at his kitchen table, looking out on the horseshoe pits he built in his own backyard, will be ready when play starts again.

It is a game Olmstead has spent years playing and honing his skill.

"I've been playing professionally 28 years," he said, although he has played the game since he was 17.

His professional career started down in Yuma, Arizona, where he and wife Jackie wintered.

They met 42 players in the RV park they stayed in, most of them playing professionally.

"We used to play seven or eight hours every day," Olmstead said.

Now, the Olmsteads travel all over Canada where Lyle competes in tournaments.

They belong to the Lethbridge Horseshoe Club, one of 12 clubs across Alberta that include Medicine Hat, Olds, Innisfail, Ponoka, High Prairie, Wetaskiwin, Bentley, Red Deer, Calgary and more.

Each hosts their own tournament.

There are also Provincial; Western Canadian, that is Alberta, BC, and Saskatchewan; Canadians; Worlds; and the Memorial, which honours players who have passed on.

Olmstead has been successful at all levels.

He has finished second twice at Worlds, including once in Red Deer.

Olmstead has won Provincials four times. The first time he won, he had his trip to St. John, New Brunswick paid for. He also went to Brampton, Ontario,

where they drove all night and all day, leaving Sunday and arriving on Wednesday, to play; as well as St. Stephen, New Brunswick, and Belleville, Ontario.

He has won Westerns three times; and won the Memorial four times in Calgary, on the only indoor pits in the world.

"It's really a good sport, and cheap," Olmstead said, adding he has met thousands of players over the years.

He is a member of the Alberta Horseshoe Pitchers Association,

which costs \$15 a year to join.

The big expense is the horseshoes themselves, which can range from \$65 to \$140.

Each one can vary in weight from two pounds, eight ounces to two pounds, two ounces.

Players compete at two different distances. Players 18 to 65 years of age throw from 40 feet, while juniors under 18, female, and players older than 65 throw at 30 feet.

Players compete one on one, side by side, but so they cannot see each other.

Each player throws two shoes at a target or pin. Three points are awarded for a ringer, and one for a close shoe. However, if both players score the same, it cancels out and no points are awarded. The first player to 40 points wins. Alternately, in some games the player with the most points after 40 shoes is the winner.

The Lethbridge club has about a dozen members, including Alfred Hansen of Claresholm, and he and the Olmsteads travel together.

The club is always looking for more members, and they play at Henderson Lake.

The secret of Olmstead's success is simple.

"Focus, focus," he said.

He concentrates on the pin, never sees past it, and doesn't see people in the crowd.

It is something that has brought Lyle Olmstead much success and many championships over the years, and a skill he will no doubt use again when play resumes.

My first World Championships 1981

It was held in Genola, Minnesota. It was kind of a fluke that I got a chance to go to a Worlds. A pitcher from Saskatchewan cancelled out, so they needed a replacement. Lawrence Johns, I think he was Canadian President, asked me if I wanted to go. I said by all means, but didn't have the money. He said that was all taken care of. We received \$1500.00 from a grant.

So, we were off. We didn't have much time and we were driving so had to hit the road hard. We couldn't get a room at the tournament, all were gone. So, it was arranged by Johns to get us a room at a town called Brainard, 30 miles from the tournament. We got to the tournament in time to play. Back then, 60 percent and up were put in the Championship Class.

12 pitchers were the number they used. We all had to qualify to see what class we were in. 16 qualified at 60% or higher. That had never happened before. Well, the meetings started by the tournament committee. We had to go 30 miles to our room, but had to wait to see where they put me and what time I played the next day. So, we waited and waited. It was getting late and had 30 miles to go. So finally, they came to a decision. They put the 4 lowest percentages in the B class, and I was at the top of the B's and didn't have to play until the afternoon, so lucked out there.

I went on to win my first and only World Class Championship. I lost one game and averaged 67.3%. I enjoyed every minute of it. I still have the big trophy. They believe in big in the States.

It was years later that I got the chance to go to more Worlds.

Enjoyed every one of them.
