BUDGET – Mary Holley

The casino income from the AHPA July casino will be deposited in November. There will be an increase in the accounting fees for this year and this was the first increase in several years.

OLD BUSINESS

WESTERN CANADA CLASSIC- Jane Cordingley

The Western Canada Classic held in High Prairie had a total of 76 participants. It was announced that Saskatchewan was unable to host the tournament any longer due to financial restrictions. In 2024, will be held in Abbotsford and 2023 – Calgary

2022 Canadian Championships – Dianne Beck

There were 115 entries, with two dropping out as well some more dropped out. It was a particularly good championship and Ray Prevost and his club; community did an excellent job.

Dianne Beck as advised as she has been the Horseshoe Canada Tournament Director for 35 years, she has resigned from that position. In all of the tournaments as Tournament Director, she has only witnessed one person getting hurt.

MEMBERSHIPS & TOURNAMENTS ENTRIES: Presented by Cindy Ekkel for Ray Prevost.

The report can be forwarded to a member if you would like to read. The major item of Ray's concern is the time consuming and tedious method of (1) applying for membership; (2) number of people involved to register for a major tournament and (3) no access for those people who do not have a bank account or cheques. At present, a person wanting to get a membership must fill out the form, give the money/cheque to the club's membership person, and then a copy is forwarded to the Membership Committee. For the two tournaments, players found the process complicated as Ray forwarded forms, accepted e transfers for approximately 30 people. Very time consuming and a busy time.

He has also suggested that memberships can be bought at any time and do not have a cut off with a tournament cut off.

Discussions. Winnona advised that people could sign up anytime however there is a set criteria for tournaments. Major tournaments are not a drop in event, and this cannot be accomplished for a major tournament.

Leo- does not the rules state the prospective applicant must have a ringer percentage before entering a major tournament?

EXECUTIVE COMMITTMENT- Ray Prevost- presented by Cindy Ekkel

Members who accept an executive position should make every attempt to attend all meetings and major tournaments in home province. It is important that the AHPA is well represented and available at major events if needed. It is understandable that there are always certain commitments or health concerns, but attendance is especially important in these positions.

Apparently, there was no acknowledgement from AHPA regarding the great job that High Prairie did for the two tournaments. Jackie advised that she had sent a letter to the Newspaper in High Prairie on behalf of AHPA. Gail & Sid send a personal email to Ray congratulating him, his club and his community on a job well done.

1. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING


Five members of the CHC attended the Canadian Championships in High Prairie.
