**ITEMS TO BE ADDED TO AGENDA:** Members were requested if any member wanted to add to agenda. No added items were received.

ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA: Rod Nieman moved to accept the agenda as presented; seconded by Louis Lallier; no discussion; Motion carried.

**APPROVAL OF 2024 AGM MINUTES:** Minutes of the 2024 AHPA AGM were distributed as well sent to members via email prior to the meeting. No errors or omissions noted. **Wes Walker moved to accept and approve the minutes as distributed**; Dave Burrows seconded, no discussion. **Motion carried.** 





TREASURERS REPORT: Ross Stevenson

As of August 31, 2025, AHPA had the following funds:

CASH: \$6373.00 TERM DEPOSITS: \$210,769 INVENTORY: \$10,290

PREPAID EXPENSES: \$750 PROPERTY, PLANT & EQUIPMENT: \$1856.

Net Assets: General Fund \$85,826: \$140,355 funds are restricted. Expenses \$14000 to Strathmore Club; Travel not recorded as not all claims were received on time.

AHPA received \$9900 from SPAR which is ½ of the \$19,800 in this fiscal year. SPAR grants may not be given to AHPA as the membership criteria is for five hundred members which AHPA does not have. Mike Holley and Dave Burrows will try and negotiate with SPAR about including other groups such as CARCARS, Disc Golf and possibly school students.

Motion from Mary Holley to accept Treasurer Report as reported; Cindy Ekkel seconded. No discussion: Motion carried.

**BUDGET REPORT:** Ross Stevenson

Ross read off the complete budget report at the meeting for the 2026 & 2027 years. The budget report must reflect as balanced every two years. Total Budget for 2026 is \$124, 510 with Expenses at \$86,690. Rick Randle moved to accept the budget; seconded by Darla Lallier; no discussion, **Motion carried.** 

#### **CORRESPONDENCE & SECRETARY REPORT** – Gail Aker

Gail reported the 2025 Society Return Forms was received in January 2025, completed the forms and forwarded to Service Alberta. Received Society Return approval in February 2025, a fast turn-around for these reports. Gail reported several emails went out to members over the course of the year.

Also, a letter from the AGLC was read at the meeting thanking for the casino financial report submitted for March 1, 2024, to February 28, 2025. Important notice that all invoices to support travel amounts are required to be attached to the expense claims. #### C. Casino Chairman - Mary Holley

Next AHPA Casino will be November 9 & 10; special thanks to the volunteers who will be helping out. The funds from this casino should be deposited around mid February.

#### D. **SPAR** – Dave Burrows

Dave advised there really wasn't a lot to report. Grant determined receiving \$19,000+; however, AHPA do not meet their criteria of having 500 members. Other venues are offered by Calgary Horseshoe Club are CARCARS; Disc Golf, and Mike & Dave will attempt to use their members as part of the grant criteria.

#### E. **BURSARIES** – Mary Holley

This year there were nine applications. Gary Bartholet and Mary reviewed the applications and references. There were nine recipients for the year. Five from zone 3 and four from Zone 2. Three of these were repeat applications and six were new applications.

#### F. TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR- Jane Cordingley

There was a total of twenty-nine tournaments across Alberta; Alberta Open in Calgary in May with 23 participants; Provincial Championships attracted 23 players, three class champions crowned; Men's-Cal Beaudoin; Women-Lindsay Hodgins; Elders- Dave Burrows. Four other mixed classes to round out the tournament.

Fall Memorial Classic with 19 players attending on Saturday and 20 on Sunday for the Doubles.

#### G. STATISTICIAN REPORT – Jane Cordingley

The stats generally made easy with the Eshoe program; however, the history on this program is lost. Jane has kept all the records from previous years. For further information on the stats regarding this report, it will be published in the Fall Newsletter.

#### H. **MEMBERSHIP REPORT** – Mary Holley

As of August 31, 2025, 161 members which includes 40 new members for this year. There are eight players who have already renewed for 2026. 25% new members in 2025; let us aim for 30% for 2026. Full report in the Fall Newsletter.

#### I. Game Related Sales – Mary Holley

Total sales of clothing, horseshoes, etc. was \$1733.00; no new stock has been purchased, and Mary is looking for a new local supplier to save on shipping costs. Final report in Fall Newsletter.





#### J. Strathmore Cottonwood Club – Wes Walker

Wes thanked the AHPA for the assistance in obtaining a grant for the club; half of the courts are now covered. As well Mike & Rick advised hurricane ties were installed. AG Society in Strathmore is in the process to apply for a \$45,000 grant.

Rick Randle, Treasurer of Strathmore Club thanked the Calgary Horseshoe Club for their donation. Mike thanked Strathmore Cottonwood Club for the payback to AHPA.

Motion from Rod Nieman to accept all reports; seconded by Don Wilby, no discussion, Motion carried.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### 1. Fall Memorial 2025- Jane Cordingley

Singles on Saturday and a new format used on Sunday for doubles; what is the consensus continuing with the doubles with all players in one class. Everyone seemed to enjoy the games; possibly playing 40 shoes instead of 32.

#### 2.2025 Western Canada Classic – Jane Cordingley

Approximately 32 players participated with 20 from Alberta; 8 from Saskatchewan and 4 from British Columbia. It proved to be a good tournament. The 2026 Western Canada Classic will be held in Manitou Beach, SK and it is a good venue; the tournament will be August 1 & 2.

#### 3. 2025 Canadian Championship – Jane Cordingley

Held in St. Joseph-de-Sorel, QC and it was a great tournament with 174 entries of which 11 were AHPA members: very tight class categories.

#### 4. 2025 Worlds Championships- Jane Cordingley

Held in Sandy, Utah with Dave Burrows attending from AHPA; finished sixth in preliminary and sixteenth in Championship Class.

Next Worlds will be held in Wausau, WI on July 13-26, 2026.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### 1. World's Double Tournament Possible bid for 2026 or 2027

Bids are being accepted for the 2026 and/or 2027 World's Double Tournament, and the Calgary Horseshoe Club members have already voted to apply to hold this particular tournament at the Calgary Horseshoe Club; however, will require participation by not only CHC but the AHPA membership. This is termed a "Standing" tournament in which the double team would use the one set of horseshoes; entry fee is \$160.00 US per team and there is a limit of 96 teams.





Mary Holley moved that AHPA support the Calgary Horseshoe Club financially and with necessary volunteers with the bid to host either the 2026 or 2027 World's Double Tournament. Jane Cordingley seconded.

Discussion: **Dianne Beck** asked is there a bid amount: Yes \$12,500 USD. **Cindy Ekkel**- is this new, yes, it is Round Robin play and winner takes all. **Dave Burrows** – is the \$12,500 USD returned if bid not accepted, yes. **Jane Cordingley** – the current year tournament has a total of 60 teams with the playoffs on Sunday. **Jackie Olmstead**- do all the clubs help with the tournament. Yes other clubs in other provinces would be asked to assist. **Don Wilby**- rumor – would it be televised; Mike advised not sure. **Dianne Beck**- can it be in late September due to other commitments.

Motion carried, no one opposed.

#### 2. 2028 Canadian Championships

# **AHPA Treasurer Report 2025**

The AHPA financial documents were compiled by Carstairs Accounting Services personnel and then reviewed by William Stevenson.

As of August 31, 2025, the assets included cash of \$6373 and Term deposit investments of \$210,769.

Of these the General fund had \$85826 and \$140,355 were restricted. Of the restricted funds \$3047 were internally restricted and \$137,309 was externally restricted.

As of April 1, 2025, AGLC made several changes to Use of Proceeds that impacted AHPA, mostly for the good.

The grant from SPAR of \$9900 was half of what was expected. AHPA will receive an additional \$19,800 in this fiscal year. This will be our last payment. SPAR required a membership of a minimum of 500. They have been very generous in the past few years and provided this grant without the required membership numbers.

Expenses were similar to the previous year except:

Donations – AHPA provided assistance to the Strathmore Cottonwood Horseshoe Club so they could cover half of their courts.

Travel – Travel out of province for the World Tournament and the Canadian Championships expenses claims were not all received in time for review and cheques to be prepared, sent out and cashed before year end. The budgeted amount will be transferred to the 2026 budget.
